Although the Union proved victorious in the American Civil War, the fruits of that victory were still in doubt. The era of Reconstruction (1865-1877) was the crucial completion of that conflict. Fundamentally, it would determine the future of the United States by attempting to resolve two dilemmas: how to admit the defeated southern states back into the Union and how to prepare 4 million ex-slaves for equality and citizenship.

Dr. Karl Valois, Professor of History at the Torrington branch of the University of Connecticut will lead the discussions of these topics at the **Harwinton Library on two consecutive Sundays: September 14 and 21, 2014 from 2:00 PM to 4:15 PM**.



A BIT OF TRIVIA

August Trivia Question: Famous abolitionist John Brown is often depicted wearing a long flowing beard. However, for most of his life he was clean shaven. Why did he grow the beard?





John Brown

John Brown was born in Torrington and lived there until he was five years old.

Convicted of murder, slave insurrection and treason, he was hanged on Dec. 2, 1859.

For his abolitionist actions he has at various times been considered a lunatic, martyr, and hero.

Historical Society member Perry Green of New Hartford wrote in with the correct answer to the August trivia question. Perry also offered some additional interesting information about John Brown, history's well-known abolitionist.

Answer to the August trivia question and more (provided by Perry Green): Abolitionist John Brown grew his beard in the latter days of his career to disguise himself during his final preparations for the raid on the Harpers Ferry arsenal in Virginia. He only wore a beard for the last two years of his life. Prior to that era, John Brown had no facial hair at all.

John Brown also used an alias of "Isaac Smith" during those times prior to the famed raid. Brown had needed to have his disguises intact as President James Buchanan had offered a \$250 reward for his capture after several anti-slavery raids in Kansas, and knowing of his plans for another raid.

Some additional historic trivia: The raid at Harpers Ferry was defeated by a unit of US Marines under the command of a Colonel Robert E. Lee, who would have his own sense of fame in the ensuing Civil War.

When on October 16, 1859 John Brown's raid took place; Harpers Ferry was in Virginia. But now that same Harpers Ferry is in West Virginia. WHY? - West Virginia didn't become West Virginia until President Lincoln proclaimed it to be a State on June 20, 1863. (Four years after the raid).

<u>Note:</u> In addition to being directly descended from Harwinton's founding father, Daniel Messenger – Abolitionist John Brown is also in Perry Green's family – he is directly descended from John Brown's grandfather, Captain John Brown of West Simsbury and Revolutionary War fame.
